Spelling Rule	No rule – children to be exposed to topic words for the ½ term	<p>-able or -ably is a suffix added if a complete root word can be heard before it. E.G. dependable dependably</p> <p>If the root words end in e then the e is removed before adding –able. E.G. admire/admirable. However, if the root word ends in –ce, –ge then the e is kept. E.G. change/changeable.</p> <p>If the root words end in e then the e is removed before adding –ably. E.G. admire/admirably.</p>		<p>-ible or -ibly is a suffix added when there is no complete root word. E.G. possible</p> <p>When the ending –ible is added to words ending with –e, –ce, or –ge, the e is removed. E.G. force/forcibly.</p>		Hyphens can be used to join a prefix to a root word to support pronunciation. If prefix ends with a vowel and the root words begins with a vowel we use a hyphen. Exception: React, coincidence				ough is one of the trickiest spellings in English – it can be used to spell a number of different sounds. Ough sounds like ort but spelt ough.
